

Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure: Report to Parents: 2016/7

Schools receive a payment, or Pupil Premium, for each child who is registered for free school meals (FSM) and those who have been in continuous care for six months or more. From April 2012 the Pupil Premium was extended to include those children who have been eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years. Schools also receive Pupil Premium for pupils whose parents are serving in the armed forces.

Overview of the school

The % of pupils in the school who are receiving free school meals, have received free school meals (FSM) in one or more of the previous 6 years (Ever 6) or are a child looked after, or a child from a service personnel.
