Fractions



In Science we will be learning to:

Light: The children will recognise that they need light in order to see things and that dark is the absence of light. They will notice that light is reflected from surfaces and that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by a solid object. The children will have the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eyes and explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them, and to predict the size of shadows when the position of the light source changes. They will recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect their eyes.

In RE we will be learning to:

The children will explore and compare how different religions and worldviews express their beliefs through the arts. They will focus on how Christians, Muslims and Buddhists express their beliefs through the arts. In the topic Incarnation they will explore what happens in a church service. At Christmas the children will explore what happens in a church service.

In PSHE we will be learning to:

The children will be looking at strengths, skills and interests that they have. They will explore how they treat each other with respect. They will also look at how they can keep healthy as they grow.

In French we will be learning to:

Revise greetings


Learning how to say where we live and where people live around the world. Children will be learning about feminine and masculine words and French grammar. They will also learn about why people visit France and what it's like to live there.

In PE we will be learning to :

The children will be learning tag rugby this half term and football next half term in games and will be learning Zumba dance. Mr Palmer is the new sports coach.

In History we will be learning to:

In our history topic the children will look at why Queen Victoria became such a popular monarch. They will find out about some famous Victorian inventions and how Victorian Britain was changed by the Industrial Revolution. They will explore what life was like for Victorian working children and how Victorian school compares to modern school.

In Computing we will be learning to:

Coding: They will look at the stages of the design, code, test, debug coding process. They will understand and use variables in 2Code and use flowcharts for design of algorithms including selection.

Online safety: They will understand how to protect themselves from online identity theft and that information put online leaves a digital footprint or trail and that this can aid identity theft.

In Music we will be learning about :

Mamma Mia: Music of the 70s and 80s where the children will learn songs and perform compositions within the song.
Glockenspiel Stage 2: Learning basic instrumental skills by playing tunes in varying styles.

In Art/Design and Technology we will be learning to:

In art the children will explore what made Henry Moore a famous sculpture and they will create a sculpture in the style of Henry Moore.

In DT they will look at why children from Tonwell School spent so much time picking blackberries and make jam tarts.
